

Adile Orhan is a medical doctor and researcher working at the intersection of clinical oncology and translational cancer research. Her research focuses on how neural and stress-related signaling shape the tumor microenvironment and influence outcomes in pancreatic and colorectal cancer, with a particular interest in perioperative interventions such as beta-blockers. Adile earned her medical degree from the University of Copenhagen and have more than five years of clinical experience. Currently affiliated with Center for Surgical Science, she combines clinical and translational research to develop biologically grounded strategies for improving cancer treatment and has been involved in conducting clinical trials since 2019. Adile has authored more than 30 peer-reviewed publications, contributed to national and international textbooks, and received the Lundbeck Foundation Talent Prize in 2024.
